A sold-out fundraiser to benefit Michael's Cause March 30 that saw 500 guests converge at the Vanderbilt on the South Beach Boardwalk, was a tremendous success thanks largely in part to the Michael's Cause committee. Michael was diagnosed with Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy within the past year at just 4 years of age and

since that time family members and friends have founded the non-profit organization dedicated to finding a cure for Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy.

The event raised about \$50,000 for Michael's Cause and an additional \$20,000 in

monetary donations.
